**AGA Tour Endorses the iGolf GPS Caddie
as its Preferred GPS Distance Finder**

San Diego, California, March 16, 2006 – The Amateur Golfers' Association (AGA) announced its approval for the use of distance finders in all tournaments for 2006 and has endorsed the iGolf GPS Caddie as its preferred GPS distance finder. The AGA's adoption of the local rule follows the USGA's new Decision 14-3/0.5 to allow clubs, tournaments and organizations to allow distance finders in competitive play (effective January 1, 2006).

The iGolf GPS Caddie is a handheld GPS distance finder which provides golfers with instant distance information to the front, center and back of the green, as well as up to eight custom points on each hole (e.g. hazards, lay-up targets, etc). Golf course files can be fully customized to a golfer's specific desires using the GPS Caddie, or can be downloaded from iGolf.com and used immediately. Additionally, an integrated 'Shot Distance' feature on the GPS Caddie allows golfers to determine and track exactly how far they hit each club.

The AGA has been offering competitive tournaments in Atlanta to golfers of all abilities since 1993. Today the AGA offers stroke play tournaments for golfers who have a USGA handicap and want competitive golf on some of the best courses in the Atlanta area. All tournaments are flighted so golfers compete against those of similar abilities. In 2006, the AGA will hold 23 events in Atlanta for its 400 members.

In announcing the AGA's endorsement of the iGolf GPS Caddie, Tyler Refling, AGA Tour Director, said: "We know that our members will welcome our decision to allow the use of distance finders since it will improve the pace of play in our tournaments. We are also very excited to have iGolf as one of our equipment sponsors and we know that our members will find that the GPS Caddie helps them to play better and record lower scores."
